<p>Maths :</p> <p>Make a timetables game which you can play with your friends to help learn and recall your timetable facts</p>	<p>PHSE</p> <p>Put a collection of items in a box with labels attached which give a clear explanation why you have chosen them.</p>	<p>Personalised-learning:</p> <p>Through the term, the children will be given targeted learning. The children have the opportunity to display and share all their targets and how they have achieved them.</p>
<p>English:</p> <p>Write an Autumn/Harvest poem using a range of adjectives and interesting vocabulary</p> <p>Your poem doesn't need to rhyme! (No acrostic poems please)</p>	<p>PE /Maths/Science/Computing</p> <p>Keep a daily record of how much physical activity you do over a week E.g. time walked to school and back, playing on your bike /scooter /clubs /walk the dog etc.</p> <p>You can present this any way you would like – table, graph, diary etc.</p>	<p>Computing/Art:</p> <p>As it is the year of computing, could you please design a poster, advertising how we stay safe on the internet? Your poster should inform people of how to keep their personal information safe as well as informing people of what to do if there is something on their computer that they are worried about.</p>

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
