You will need to think about what you would like in it and calculate the perimeters of your flower beds to make sure it fits. Some of you might even research prices to calculate a budget for the new garden.</p>	<p>Art:</p> <p>Using recyclable materials, can you create a collage of a beautiful landscape in the world? It may be a view of the ocean or a forest – the choice is yours. I am looking to see how you colour match and how well you bring your picture to life.</p>	<p>PE:</p> <p>As sports day is fast approaching, I would like you to practise for the big day. We will be participating in running, skipping, sack, bean-bag and relay races. You could look at how to improve your strategies to see if you could make a difference to your performance.
