What have we been learning?

This week the children have developed skills in writing to recap using capital letters, full stops and using the conjunction 'and'. We have started to discuss different ways we can help the animals in the ocean. We won't tell you too much as our big blue day will reveal all.



As it is anti-bullying this week the children have discussed what it is and who we can go to if something is bothering us at home or in school. They have also enjoyed designing, peer critiquing and painting their pebbles with shapes and symbols that represent what makes them unique in the style of a fish from the book 'only one you'. The pebbles will be placed along the walkways into school!
