## **Educational visits**

## **Clifton Cathedral**

Year 6 children participated in the annual Carol Service at Clifton Cathedral, which offered another opportunity for them to sing!

Earlier in the term, Topaz class visited Redwood to learn about autumn and only this week, Sapphire class have been to Bristol Zoo to conclude their learning about the Rainforest.

#### Football

Our football teams continue to be very successful.

#### **Girls Football results**:

The team were placed 2nd in a tournament held at KLB, losing only one game in five. Three girls continue to play for the South Glos representative team for year 6 - Freya Marshall, Maia Parmar and Olivia Belsten. The squad only has 22 girls in total from across the county.

#### **Boys Football results:**

The boys beat St Marys 6-1 in the league, Mangotsfield 8-5 and The Manor 10-1 and 11-3 in the cup. They also showed outstanding sportsmanship, agreeing to play in different and unfamiliar positions once they reached 6 goals in these matches.

The team reached the Quarter Finals in the South Glos. ESFA cup.

Louis Templeton and Luke Shrewsbury have both played for the South Glos. representative team.

#### **Cross country**

Our KS2 cross country runners have taken part in the races hosted by KLB and are doing extremely well, with two more races to go until we get the final results.

#### Swimming

Year 3 children have completed their swimming sessions; next term we will be taking those children in Years 4, 5 and 6 who have not yet gained their 25 metre badge, which is a requirement of the National Curriculum. Parents of children in Y4, 5, and 6, please ensure you send your form in before the end of term, as the sessions start on the first Thursday back (7<sup>th</sup> January).

#### **Time4 reading**

#### Tim Peake's mission to the International Space Station

Yesterday the whole school watched the launch to the ISS and Mrs Brooks led some discussion around this. We are hoping to continue to follow the developments as part of our Year of Science.
