# Premises

During the school holidays Tom's Garden has been re-furbished and re-painted creating a relaxing space for the children to use at play times and lunch times. Thank you to Mr Gilbert, our caretaker, for working so hard on this.

To improve the learning environment, Diamond and Amethyst classes have had new carpets fitted and Emerald and Jet classes have been re-decorated. The staffroom has also been re-furbished.

### **BE HEALTHY**

The water fountains are now in use again, but please remember to send your child to school each day with a bottle of **water**.

### **School lunches**

Lunch arrangements are flexible. Your child may bring sandwiches to school or alternatively they may have a school lunch every day or just on specific days. You may choose which days your child would like a school lunch.

The cost per day is £2 for children in KS2. School meals are free for all children in Foundation and Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2). Irrespective of this, please ensure you complete the necessary paperwork if you are entitled to free school meals due to your personal circumstances, as we do receive additional funding for children who are entitled to free school meals. This is used to provide them with additional educational support.

Meals must be paid for in advance. Please send money for the week on Monday mornings in an envelope with your child's name, class and which days they are having school lunch clearly written on it. If you prefer, you can pay for the term's lunches by cheque made payable to South Gloucestershire Council or via SIMs Agora, our on-line payment system. If you have difficulty at any time making a payment, please contact Mrs McNeill in the school office as soon as possible. Please do not allow arrears to accrue – we are obliged to report these to South Gloucestershire.

Please support us by ensuring your child's lunch box contains a balance of foods and plenty of healthy options.

#### **Nut allergies**

We have a number of children in school who have nut allergies and who can suffer severe reactions, even if only in the proximity of someone eating nuts. This includes all nuts, not just peanuts. Therefore I would ask you not to send peanut butter sandwiches, nut bars or any other food item containing nuts in your child's packed lunch. Please also avoid sending kiwi fruit as we have a child with a severe allergy to kiwi. Thank you for your co-operation.

# Life Bus

The Life Bus will be coming to school on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> and Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November. This reinforces messages about healthy lifestyles.

# **STAY SAFE**

We have an 'Open Door' policy, which means staff are available to speak with you at relatively short notice, however, if you do need to speak to someone, please remember to access the school through the main entrance only, so you can be signed in. This is an important part of our safeguarding procedures.

# Dropping off and picking up

These are key times when we need to ensure the children's safety due to the volume of traffic around the school at these times.

Please remember that the designated 'drop off' zone is literally to stop and drop your children off and must not be used to park in. This ensures the system works well. The car park is for use by staff and the disabled only. Please do not block the drives of residents in Honeybourne Way or other nearby roads.

# Science focus

This year we have decided to introduce a curriculum focus for this and each subsequent academic year. This year's focus across the school will be upon Science. This means that a range of activities, visits and visitors will be based around scientific topics. Of course all the National Curriculum core and non-core subjects will be taught as usual.
