PE kit

It is very important that your child has their PE kit in school every day – shorts, house or plain white T-shirt and daps as a minimum. It is a legal requirement that children do PE every week, as it is part of the National Curriculum. If your child does not have their kit, they will have to wear the spare kit we have in school. We would appreciate donations of any outgrown items of PE kit should this be needed. Thank you for your help and co-operation with this.

School uniform

Just a reminder that if girls are wearing boots to school, these need to be black ankle boots, as stated in our uniform policy.

Cross country

The cross country season has started again and some of our children are participating in the Saturday races at KLB.

Swimming

We are still desperate for a parent to accompany staff and children to the swimming pool on Tuesday afternoons, initially until Christmas. Girls' football

This year we are also taking part in some of the Thornbury Cluster sports events. The first of these is orienteering for KS1 and KS2 children, which will take place on 14th November.

The next event will be pop lacrosse; this involves the children learning how to play and then playing against each other.

He worked with all the year groups across the school, including reception, and was amazed by the children's focus, behaviour and developing resilience. He kept saying how much he loved our school and how special a place it is!

I have been undertaking some pupil conferencing following this and all the children were able to tell me clearly what they had learnt and knew that they needed to take responsibility for solving their problems, without relying on others or adults to help them, unless they had a big or serious problem! They also seem to have understood how this will help them in the future too! Tom also provided an inspirational evening for parents, staff and governors and certainly gave everyone plenty of food for thought. He told the parents that they were lucky to have their children at Alexander Hosea. He also said he would like to be a little boy or a member of staff here – this is a great compliment from someone who visits schools across the UK and all over the world!

One of our parents, Jane Daniels, very kindly agreed to write a summary for those parents who were unable to attend; she said having to do this proved that having a growth mindset works! I have attached her words of wisdom! Thank you, Jane!
