## Severe weather procedures

Sometimes the Local Authority will make a decision to close all schools in South Gloucestershire. At other times, this decision is left to individual schools. If a decision is made to close the school, you will receive a text and the closure will also be posted on our school website and on the South Gloucestershire website. Local media (radio stations, TV) also report school closures.

Last term children from Y1-Y6 completed a unit of learning about how to keep themselves safe online. This is of course on-going in school, but with many children probably having technological devices for Christmas it is important for you to help your child/ren to stay safe on the internet at home too.
