Story Walk workshop

I organised a writing event which we hosted for some of our more able writers along with some from other local schools too. They had the opportunity to experience a Story Walk using i-pads; this involved solving and writing riddles using the outdoor learning environment. The children all enjoyed this and produced some excellent riddles as a result.

Music workshop

This involved a group of our older KS2 pupils attending a workshop at Marlwood Secondary School where they produced and recorded music in the recording studio – another fantastic experience with a positive impact on pupil outcomes!

Music concerts

All children who are learning to play drums, keyboards or guitars in school have performed to their parents. This is a great opportunity to hear what they have learnt and see the progress they have made during the year. Well done to all our musicians!

Sports events

Our **school sports day** was a resounding success once again, despite the heat! There was a real family holiday feel and lots of positive feedback - thank you for coming along to join us, for providing and erecting gazebos and for competing in the parent races which proved very competitive! A special thank you to two of our Governors - Simon Burton and Gareth Fielding for keeping everyone informed of events via the PA system, the PTA for providing refreshments and all the staff for their contribution to the day, especially the Teaching Assistants who planned and ran the day.

District Sports, hosted by KLB for local primary schools, was another success story with around 40 of our children taking part. They all ran their races with enthusiasm and determination and were a credit to you as parents and to the school. Many were placed in their events – with lots coming first or second.

Football

The Y5 children undergoing training from Bristol City Football Club took part in a football tournament on 3rd July in a team made up of our pupils and those from St. Mary's Primary School, Bradley Stoke. They did really well and were knocked out at the quarter final stage on penalties.

Golf

Children benefited from some golf lessons in school provided by a local pro. These gave the children the opportunity to have a go at a sport which is not part of the usual curriculum. They enjoyed this and improved their striking skills.

Wickwar Fun Run and Games

This was another successful event. It was good to see that a number of children from school took part in the Fun Run, with Potters winning the cup for the most children participating in their house T-shirt. Well done, Potters!

The games at the playing field were well attended too, with the children enjoying another opportunity to take part in a variety of races.

Year 6 Pantomime

The Year 6 children's performance of Cinderella Rockerfella last night was phenomenal. Their acting and singing skills are amazing and their performance certainly played to their strengths. We were extremely proud of them all.

Time4Reading

You will recently have received a letter about this new South Gloucestershire initiative, which we are launching in school before the end of term. Our aim is for the school community as a whole, to engage in reading during the summer holiday and make a start on reading some of the titles on the top 100 books for different age groups. At the beginning of this academic year, we introduced our new Behaviour Management Strategy, which has proved extremely positive. The children have responded very well and we have also received lots of really positive feedback from parents and visitors to the school regarding this.

In recognition of those children who have achieved "supersonic" during the year, we have arranged for them to have a treat on Wednesday morning.

Transition

Our current Year 6 children have all been involved in visits to their new secondary schools as part of the transition process. They have found this useful – particularly in relation to finding their way round!

Assessment outcomes — we have much to celebrate — well done to all the children and the staff!

End of year data is very positive with 83% of the cohort reaching a Good Level of Development. This compares very favourably with previous local and national data. Mrs Windmill and Ms Johns are to be congratulated for their commitment and dedication to teaching and learning to ensure children make outstanding progress.

Phonic Screening

The children all did very well with 89% screening. This is another great result. I would like to thank Mrs Windmill and Mrs Wheeler for supporting the children with this to ensure they did their best and Mrs Windmill for administering the screening, in Miss Pursey's absence.

SATs

The Year 2 children should all feel very proud of their achievements in reading, writing and maths, with most achieving at least the expected level and many achieving more highly. (Please note the SATs levels reported are the old National Curriculum levels). Mrs Cleverley, Mrs Sprosen and Mrs Barry are to be recognised for their contribution and support which enabled the children to attain so highly.

The Year 6 children similarly did extremely well in all three core areas and their progress from the end of KS1 has been very positive too. Again the SATs levels reported are the old National Curriculum levels. A big 'thank you' to all staff who have taught the children during KS2 and to Mrs Moncrieff, Mrs Gee, Mrs Wheeler, Mrs Brooks, Mrs Shrewsbury, Mrs McAleese and Mr Barry for their dedication this year.
