## Great news – Alexander Hosea is a safe and healthy school!

Every two years the Local Authority's 'Health and Safety' department visits school to undertake an audit of our health and safety related policies and procedures. We always work hard to ensure that we provide a safe and healthy learning and working environment for the children and other members of our school community. We usually pass with flying colours and I am thrilled to announce that, once again, we have got an excellent rating and our attention to detail has been recognised. This is to be celebrated!

## **Prescribed Medicines**

We have recently attended training provided by the Local Authority regarding the administration of prescribed medicines. School staff do not have to agree to administer these, but where they do, you must ensure that all medicines provided are in the correct packaging with the instruction leaflet enclosed with a pharmacy label containing the child's name, type of medicine and dosage. A calibrated spoon/syringe must also be enclosed.

## Scooting to school

Please can I remind you that children must not ride their scooters once on the school site – this includes scooting around the playground at the end of the day and applies to younger and older brothers and sisters too.

## Dogs

It has been reported to me that dogs are sometimes brought onto the school site. Please can I remind you that they must remain outside the gates and away from where the children are leaving the school. Thank you.

## **On-line safety**

Following my last newsletter, and in support of the activities undertaken with the children as part of our Safer Internet week before half term, I am attaching the checklists provided by Vodaphone for your information. It is really important to set boundaries, parental controls and be aware of what your children are accessing on-line.

#### **RSPB Bird Watch Update**

The children from all classes took part in the national bird watch last term and identified many different species, attracted by the food provided. As a result, they have learnt the names of some of our British birds, both common and less common.

#### Tim Peake's mission to the International Space Station

Topaz class has continued to follow Tim Peake and on 2<sup>nd</sup> February, along with 400,000 children in primary and secondary schools in 58 different countries, they became part of the 'Cosmic Classroom', which provided a live link with the International Space Station. The children are all inspired by their learning based on a 'space' theme!

### **Recycling Event**

On 18<sup>th</sup> February, two members of South Gloucestershire's Recycling Team visited the school to teach the children about recycling as part of an assembly; they also led sessions in Jet and Sapphire classes and met with our Eco Club at lunch time. You will have met them at the school gate providing information about how you can get involved too.

The next big event is chick hatching. We will take delivery of some eggs and an incubator next week and the children will have the opportunity to see them hatch and start to grow – how exciting! If all goes to plan, we are hoping to set up a webcam so they can be watched via our website. #### Pond Area

A fair amount of work was undertaken on improving this area last year, particularly by parents, but with spring on the way, it needs some more TLC before it can be used by the children. We are grateful to the Friends for purchasing three new picnic tables / benches for us, which will be sited in the conservation area to be used by the children when undertaking nature study.

#### 'The Day of the Dot'

This is the title of a book which has an important message for children about believing in themselves, which links with our work on developing a growth mind set; it happens to be based on the development of art skills. 'The Day of the Dot' was launched by Mrs Windmill during an assembly on Monday and will provide a focus for the school now and in the future. Self-belief will be encouraged through this term's SEAL theme (Going for Goals) and our 'Inclusion' value.

It is essential that all children acquire basic mental arithmetic skills, including knowing number bonds and times tables. This will help them feel more confident about number and enable them to problem solve and access more difficult mathematical concepts.

Our boys' football team played their quarter final match last term. They played extremely well but were unfortunately beaten. Better luck next time!

They also played a match against St Michael's School, Winterbourne and lost gracefully – 4-0, although they had a better second half, ensuring no further goals were scored.

The last Cross Country run at KLB had to be postponed due to a waterlogged field! We have great hopes for our runners who are doing particularly well, so look forward to the completion of the competition and final results.
