Stay Safe

Safety at dropping off and picking up times

This is an on-going issue and one which was discussed at the last Parish Council meeting. Please:-

- be mindful of parking safely, avoiding the corners at the top and bottom of Honeybourne Way to ensure vision is good.

- keep clear the entrance to residents' driveways.
- use the drop off zone for dropping off only drivers should not leave their car here.
- do not use the staff car park to enter the school premises.

To help with this issue, the school has once again approached The Buthay; they have very kindly agreed that parents can park their cars in the pub car park at the start and end of the school day, so that you and your child/ren can walk the last bit to school. This should help ease the congestion in the roads around school.

I would like to extend my thanks to the Buthay for their generosity in supporting the school. This is a great community link!

Internet Safety

As part of Internet Safety day, children undertook a range of activities to remind them about how to keep themselves safe when using the internet. Two community police officers came along to school to take a session with the Y5 and Y6 children, but were unfortunately called away just as they arrived. We are hoping to re-arrange this.

Enjoy and Achieve

National Curriculum and Assessment procedures 2014-15

The new National Curriculum is being implemented in school this year for Years 1, 3, 4 and 5. Children in Y2 and Y6 are continuing to be taught the previous National Curriculum as their SATs will be based upon this.

With the new curriculum come increased expectations of the children across all age groups; these are especially in relation to English and Maths, where the learning is very challenging. The curriculum for these subjects is organised in year groups.

In addition, the Government has discontinued use of the old National Curriculum levels that were used to assess children, and have now allowed schools to choose their own assessment procedures. Teachers are working extremely hard with the children to help them meet the specified expected standards for their year group. These are called Age Related Expectations. We have adopted a new assessment system promoted by South Gloucestershire which identifies children as being assessed as either 'developing', 'secure', or 'exceeding' the age related expectation. Under the new curriculum, all schools are finding that children who were previously working above expectation are now just about meeting the 'secure' criteria and children who were working at the expected level or below, meet 'developing' criteria. Very few children are currently meeting the 'exceeding' criteria for their year group. As you will understand, this makes it difficult to make comparisons between the children's previous and current achievements and to compare results of schools locally and nationally. Hopefully this will be resolved over time.

There are no changes to the existing EYFS curriculum, which was changed three years ago.

Curriculum theme for Term 4

This term our school theme is 'Stories'. We launched the theme in various ways – upper Key Stage 2 classes received an invitation to a 'ball' in the hall, with various related follow-up activities. The bedtime stories were also a great success, with many children from each class

coming along in their pyjamas etc. - A big 'thank you' to PTA members who supported the event by providing biscuits and making the hot chocolate. Learning overviews for each class are available from the school's website.

World Book Day

Children shared their favourite books, authors and characters in class to celebrate World Book Day last Thursday.

Long term plans for Alexander Hosea School

All schools have a long term, strategic plan. Our strategic plan runs until the end of July this year, so we are busy identifying what we believe should be the school's priorities for the next five years. We need some help with this, especially as it is important that all members of the school community have the opportunity to share their views, so that these can be discussed and included where possible. The current national context will also have an important role to play in determining some of our goals and targets.

The staff have already started work on this and the Governors are meeting later this week to begin considering the long term plans for the school. It is vital that parents are also involved as key stakeholders. Parent Council suggested that it would be a good idea to run an informal coffee morning (or similar) in order to gather the views of parents. I have therefore scheduled Thursday 26th March at 9.10am (after drop off), in the Blue Room, for this purpose. I look forward to seeing as many of you there as possible.

Cross country

This is an inter-schools event which children participate in annually during the winter months. I am very grateful to Mrs McAleese for training the children as part of her Cross Country Club and for arranging to get our children involved. Once again they have done extremely well this year with Maia Parmar coming 4th overall in the Y5/6 girl's competition and Luke Shrewsbury coming 6th overall in the boy's Y5/6 competition. Maia and Luke have both been chosen to represent Avon in a cross country competition in Cheltenham on 21st March. Henry Smith, Adam Shrewsbury and Luke Shrewsbury received medals for coming third overall as a team, which was a first for the Year 5s. A special 'well done' to all of them!

Football matches

The football team has once again been busy playing matches against other local schools:-In a home match against St. Mary's, Yate on 5th March they drew 1-1. They won 4-1 against Elm Park and 8-2 against Coalpit Heath, therefore winning 2 and drawing one – a great achievement! Well done!

Science

This week we are having a Science week in school. The children will all be involved in a range of Science - based activities. This is being launched with a Science assembly led by Fizz Pop. There will be an opportunity for children to join an after school Science club following this.

Some of our more able scientists will be chosen to attend a Science session with children from other local schools (EYFS – Tuesday 24th March, KS1 and 2 – Wednesday 25th March).

Thank you for ordering a copy of the upper KS2 Christmas performance. I hope you have enjoyed listening to this again!!

The Year 6 children are busy practising the songs which they will be performing at the Colston Hall with other South Gloucestershire Primary schools on 22nd March. This is a wonderful opportunity for them. I am very much looking forward to this.
