#### **Year 4 Times Tables Assessment**

Our Year 4 children will be taking part in the national times tables test for the first time in summer 2019. The national expectation is that all children should have quick recall for all their tables up to 12x12 by the end of Year 4. Whilst we do not know the exact format for this new online test, we do know that the children will have 6 seconds to answer each question, so rapid recall is essential.
