Blended Learning

Thank you so much for all your feedback about blended learning in the past 10 days. Hearing from parents about what is working well is as helpful as suggested tweaks to provision, as it helps us to identify what to do more of to support children and families. Please keep talking to us.

One of the comments we have received from some parents is about the challenge of balancing 5 intense remote learning days with their own work commitments. We have reflected on this as a staff and have come up with a solution to help ease the pressure somewhat.

From next week, the teachers will continue with their structured remote learning, with live/recorded video clips etc on Monday to Thursday (in the same way as the past 10 days).

Friday will then become more flexible to allow time for children to catch up with any remaining remote learning activities; engage in open-ended tasks on Google Classroom, usually following on from previous days learning; complete TTRS, Mathletics and/or Bugclub activities.

Teachers will still be contactable through Google Classroom/email on Friday mornings and may choose to run small social or learning Teams sessions for children, depending on needs identified during the week.

Children are not expected to complete homelearning at the weekend and we would strongly encourage parents to try to protect weekend times (depending on parent working patterns) for quality family time and doing activities together that bring you together as a family unit and make your child feel happy.

FREE Eye Tests for children at UWE

Being able to see clearly is important for a child's overall development and helps them to discover and learn about their world. Most children have excellent sight and do not need to wear glasses, but if there are problems and they are not picked up at an early age, children may have permanently reduced vision in one or both eyes. Some schools carry out vision screening on children between the ages of four and five. Even if this has been done, or if you have concerns, if there is a history of needing glasses at a young age, or a history of a squint or lazy eye in the family you should take them along to an eye examination.

Things to look out in young children include avoiding reading, writing or drawing, screwing eyes up when reading or watching tv, and having concentration problems at school.

Our specialist optometrist clinic will be able to take the time to examine children's eyes and provide tailored advice about children's current eye health needs and baseline vision assessment for the future.

The appointments will be on a Thursday for the under 12's which will last 90 minutes with an Optometrist from the Bristol Eye Hospital who has a specialist interest in paediatric eye care. There will be anything from 1-4 patients observing/participating depending on Covid restrictions and space allowing. The over 12's will be booked into the student clinics on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, and the appointments will be anything from 1-2 hours, as the students perform the tests and then this is double checked by a qualified optometrist. The eye clinic has all the specialist equipment to be able to assess the children in a friendly, professional manner. We have tests that allow for young children who may not be confident with their letters and games that we can play to assess their vision and put them at ease.

Violence against women and girls – call for evidence launched by the Home Office

The Home Office have launched a call for evidence to inform the development of the government's next Tackling Violence Against Women and Girls Strategy. Views are sought from those with lived experience of harm as well as those with expertise in working with victims and survivors, those involved in preventative activity and those involved in providing services. This includes relevant professionals, such as those working in social care, education, law enforcement, local government, public health and healthcare. Anyone aged 16 or over is welcome to contribute to the call for evidence and does not have to have experienced violence or abuse to take part.
