At Alexander Hosea, we are proud to...




We have some new visuals coming soon and the website will be updated over time to remove the outgoing ASPIRE values and ELLI and add the new school values.


We have now booked scooter training for Year 3 and pedestrian training for Year 5 for the summer term.
