As usual we had a full agenda for our Full Governing Body meeting on 16th May, including agreeing the school budget for the next financial year. As I am sure you are aware, budgets are very tight and the school is working hard to ensure best value for money and making savings where possible whilst ensuring that the quality of teaching and learning remains as high as ever. To help us achieve that we are grateful for the support of parents by attending and contributing to the events organised by the Friends of AHS.

We talked about different aspects of safeguarding including how the building is being maintained with a planned programme of improvements to ensure that it remains safe place for all staff and children.

Mrs Williams shared with us news about the very good levels of attendance of all children, the progress that the children are making and how the teachers ensure that information is shared with the next class teacher to allow for a smooth transition to the next year group.

By now you will all have received our request for nominations to become a parent governor. We hope that you will take time to consider this. Everyone has skills and knowledge that can support the governing body and therefore support the school in maintaining the high standard of education that your children enjoy. There are 5 full governing body meetings during the academic year along with 5 meetings for each of the three committees.
