# Jacket potatoes

As jacket potatoes are becoming a popular choice at the moment, some of the older children have been worried that they have not had the chance to choose to have one (as they have all gone before their sitting, on some days). It has been tricky for the catering team to know how many jacket potatoes to put in each day, as different amounts of children want them each day. This means that sometimes there is a lot of waste and sometimes disappointed children.

We are in the process of looking into a meal ordering system (as suggested by the Catering Working Party last year) and South Glos are hoping to be able to roll out a pilot to a few schools in the summer term. Once we have found out how this system might work and how much it will cost, we will make a decision about whether it would suit our school.

In the meantime, the staff have suggested that they ask the children at morning register how many children would like jacket potatoes. This will then give Deb and Antonia helpful information about how many to cook each day.

# **Breaktime snacks**

For many years, we have had the expectation that children only have toast or fruit at break time. Recently we have noticed some breakfast style bars and malt loaf coming in. Whilst these might be suitable for lunchboxes, please could we ask that only fruit is brought from home as a breaktime snack. Thank you.
