PE kit for sporting events

We are using some of our sports premium funding to purchase a new kit for the children to wear when representing the school at local sporting events. This is royal blue with the school logo on the top and shorts and blue socks. The children will look very smart in this and will be easily recognisable. In the meantime, if your child is representing the school at a local sporting event, please can you make sure s/he is wearing their school PE kit.

Swimming – Jet class

This year we have decided to take the older children swimming so that they can achieve their 25 metre badge. This is a more targeted approach, which we will continue with in the immediate future. Some children participated in a badminton taster session, which provided the opportunity to try a new sport.

Archery event

Children were entered into an archery tournament at KLB and found they had some skills they didn't know they had! Thank you to parents for providing transport.

Sports Leaders

The sports leaders have now been trained by Sharron Bates from KLB. They are supporting the children at lunch times and have a new noticeboard in the playground which lets children know who the leaders are and the rules for the games they are teaching them to play. This was funded through our sports premium too. Miss Pursey has also led a couple of assemblies to ensure all the children understand how this works.

The KS1 children all went to take part in an event hosted by KLB along with children from about sixteen other schools.
