#### From Mrs Williams:

#### **Bristol Zoo**

Bristol Zoo trip is fast approaching. We would like all children to arrive for an early registration at 8:20am, so that we can get going early and make the most of the day. We are planning to return to school for a normal end of day. We are really looking forward to spending the day together at this venue. Children will need a drink, packed lunch and a rain jacket. They will wear school uniform, but can wear trainers instead of school shoes if they would like to. To assist the coaches and make sure that the area is safe, please could we ask that children are dropped promptly.

Parents/Carers with mobility issues/children with mobility issues will still be able to access the staff car park as usual.

We will continue to keep abreast of advice about school trips in light of the current health situation and let you know if we decide to postpone the trip until a later date. In the meantime, we will continue to plan for it as normal.

# Coronavirus update – also see items below

As you will know, this is a changing situation and the Government stepped up their action plan to the delay phase last night. The advice is now that any people (children or adults) with a high temperature (38C+) or constant cough must self-isolate at home for 7 days. We do have thermometers in school and will test children's foreheads if they say they feel unwell during the school day. At this point in time, there is no plan to close schools. We will follow all Public Health and Local Authority advice. As the situation develops, it is possible that there will be staff and pupil absence. If pupils are off school in self-isolation, their teacher will provide a list of planned activities that they should be doing at home during the week. In the future months, there may be points when classes may need to combine into larger groups, should we be unable to access supply cover for staff sickness. We will continue to offer the very best that we can during the unsettled times ahead.

# **Coronavirus – Advice for parents/guardians**

At this point, there is no reason why your children should not continue to attend their early years, school or further education setting as normal. If your child starts to feel unwell and you are concerned, contact 111 for advice.

The Government and NHS are well prepared to deal with this virus. You can help too. Germs can live on some surfaces for hours. To protect yourself and others:

- Wash your hands regularly and encourage your child to do the same.
- Encourage your child to drink plenty of water.
- Always carry tissues with you and use them to catch your cough or sneeze.
- Bin the tissue, and to kill the germs, wash your hands with soap and water, or use a sanitiser gel.
- If you have arrived back from another country, follow the specific advice for returning travellers.

All children's water bottles will be coming home with them today. Please wash them thoroughly and make sure that they are clearly named before returning them to school on Monday.

#### Handwashing

We regularly encourage children to wash their hands in school (particularly before they eat).

It would be very helpful if all families could reinforce good hand hygiene at home, so that children have a consistent message at home and school.

There are some fun utube videos that children can watch to help them to wash their hands well. The Happy Birthday song can be helpful too.

The club is open from 7.45 am until 9.00 am and 3.30 pm until 6.00 pm weekdays. We also offer some holiday care from 8.00 am till 6 pm according to demand.

WOOSC aim to provide childcare in a safe, secure and relaxed environment, offering a range of activities to reflect the interests of children who use the club. We currently have a vacancy for an Unqualified Staff Playworker (based at The Olive Pollard Community Centre) The post is for 9 hours 10 minutes per week (term-time only) with a starting salary of £8.21 per hour. The successful candidate/s will need:

- to be available to work at our Wickwar site from 07:40 to 09:00 every weekday (term-time only) and from 3.30 until 6.00 pm one evening per week.
