Congratulations to everyone who took part and to Jessica (Y6), whose design will be used this year.



Parents' Evening

We have had a few difficulties with our online parents' evening booking system this time, as a result of an increase in numbers of children (beyond 30) in some classes and some families booking more than one appointment per child. A card with the sender's name and a photograph is also a nice thing to include Above all, the contents should be of good quality, remembering that the recipient will be opening the box in eager anticipation, and especially with the loys for the children, quite possibly the first real gifts they have received for a very long time.
