
#### What is a School Trust?



A multi-academy trust is a group of schools working in deep and purposeful collaboration as one legal entity to improve and maintain high educational standards.

A School Trust has a single legal and moral purpose at the heart of the Articles of Association, or legal responsibilities: to advance education for public benefit. School Trusts are subject to both charity and company law and are accountable to the Department of Education.

#### Who are The Leaf Trust?






#### Who are The Leaf Trust?



## Things that would stay the same:

The name of the school, including using the term 'Primary School'.

The school uniform.

The school logo.

The school's leadership team, including the Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher.

The language of schools would continue to be used, e.g. Primary School, not Primary Academy, Headteacher not Principal.
The school's curriculum.
The extra-curricular provision

The culture of the school.

The staff team.

offered.

The terms and conditions for staff, including their pay and pensions.
The admissions arrangements.
OFSTED would still inspect the school.

SIAMS would still inspect church schools.

The school would retain its Governing Body.

# Things that would change:

Increased support and capacity for school improvement.

Increased development and training for staff.

The processing systems used for finance, payroll, Health and Safety, and Human Resources.

The ability to pool and share resources.

Governors would focus on the quality of education and the outcomes of children rather than finance and operations.
