#### From Mrs Williams:

The Government and NHS are well prepared to deal with this virus. You can help too. Germs can live on some surfaces for hours. To protect yourself and others:

Wickwar Out of School Club (WOOSC) is registered with Ofsted, and is run as a not for profit organisation, based in The Olive Pollard Community Rooms adjacent to the Alexander Hosea School in Wickwar. The club is open from 7.45 am until 9.00 am and 3.30 pm until 6.00 pm weekdays. We also offer some holiday care from 8.00 am till 6 pm according to demand.

WOOSC aim to provide childcare in a safe, secure and relaxed environment, offering a range of activities to reflect the interests of children who use the club. We currently have a vacancy for an Unqualified Staff Playworker (based at The Olive Pollard Community Centre) The post is for 9 hours 10 minutes per week (term-time only) with a starting salary of £8.21 per hour. The successful candidate/s will need:

- to be available to work at our Wickwar site from 07:40 to 09:00 every weekday (term-time only) and from 3.30 until 6.00 pm one evening per week.
- previous experience of working with children aged 4-12
- ability to provide and facilitate safe, creative play
- good communication skills and confidence when speaking to parents/carers and children

We provide flexible working conditions, the opportunity to work as part of a team and provide training and support. The closing date for applications is to be confirmed. Interviews will be held once short listing has taken place and a start date will be confirmed with the successful candidate(s) taking into consideration any notice period required.
