Dear Parents/Carers


The children had a great time on World Book Day and it was wonderful to see them all dressed up and having fun celebrating to joy of reading together.

Free School Meals

If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals – Pupil Premium (see information opposite) and your child is in any school year at our school, please follow the link to apply. In addition for free meals, the associated pupil premium funding follows the child throughout their primary school experience. This can be used to fund a range of support for your child (including clubs, uniform, trips etc).

The Queen's Canopy

This week the children in Topaz and Amethyst took part in planting some hedgerow plants and trees as part of the Queen's Canopy.

The plants were donated through 'The Tree Council – Orchards for Schools'. Mrs Windmill and Mrs Brooks were very proud of the positive way in which our oldest and youngest children collaborated to fulfil this challenge.

Free school meals

All children and young people

Your child may be able to get free school meals in Year 3 and above if you receive any of the following:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods, and your monthly average income over three assessment periods should be no more than £616.67)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.
