If your child is in year 6 and was born between 1 September 2012 and 31 August 2013 (inclusive), they must attend a secondary school in September 2024 unless you decide to educate your child at home. This is a very important decision and you are strongly advised to read the <u>South Gloucestershire Secondary</u> <u>school admissions guide</u> before making any decisions and completing your application. During the day, the children will be having taster sessions of Science, Languages, Art and PE.


