Celebrations and latest news

- We have booked our **whole school trip** for the year. We will be going to **Berkeley Castle on 21<sup>st</sup> March**. Thanks to the Friends, the trip is **completely free** for every child. Friends have used the funds raised at the Christmas Fair, Christmas Shopping Eve and Christmas Disco to pay for the coach and entry costs (£10.75 per child). The school will be closed on this date between 9:30am-2:30pm.
- On Tuesday, Y5 pupils took part in the **Festival of Dance** at Abbeywood. We are really proud of Pearl Class for their determination and enthusiasm to learn the two dance routines and using their emerald powers to be brave to perform in front of an audience. Years 3 & 6 will be taking part in dance sessions with New Generation Dance.


### **Online Safety**
