From the Headteacher...

We have started Term 4 with many memorable events including Bedtime Stories, World Book Day, yoga and dance sessions. With so much going on, it feels like we have been back from half term for longer! As usual the children have made us proud as they have thrown themselves into every opportunity with enthusiasm and a growth mindset.

Celebrations and latest news

- We took part in **World Book Day** yesterday. It was fantastic to see the children (and staff) dressed up as their favourite book characters.
- Year 6 have started their **cycle training**. The instructors have commented that they are impressed with their excellent behaviour and positive attitudes.
- Years 1/2 have started their taster **yoga** sessions.
