The club providers need this information to have up-to-date registers, contact details, medical needs and collection arrangements. They found at football this week that a significant group of children arrived at clubs, who were not on the register.

Attendance

We are proud of our good attendance at Alexander Hosea and we know that families are committed to making sure that their child(ren) attend well so that they can make the most of the high quality education on offer.

Good attendance and punctuality are important for children to build good routines and to be able to access the full education and positive social experiences on offer at our school. Evidence shows that when children attend school well, they also achieve well and are better prepared for the next stage of their education.

We know that children do get unwell from time to time and it is very important that if your child has been sick or had diarrhoea that they are kept away from school for 48 hours to prevent the spread of infection.

Attendance is monitored each term. Where attendance falls below 90% (well below the school average of 97%), this is classed as 'persistent absentee' and contact will be made with parents to seek ways to improve the child's attendance at school.

We do not authorise holidays in term time, as it is disruptive to children's learning. With this in mind, please note the term dates for South Glos Council below when booking family holidays for the next academic year. Please note that holidays for South Glos and Gloucestershire schools (including KLB) are different in October 2018 (and this coming Easter).

Winter Illnesses

I understand that a group of children in the Infants have succumbed to a winter sickness bug in the past week and I know this can be upsetting for children and their families. Unfortunately this is the time of year when people can sometimes become unwell. As the weather begins to warm up these winter illnesses tend to decrease.

To help prevent the spread of illnesses, please keep children off school for 48 hours from the time the last sickness/diarrhoea ends. We are happy to welcome children back at any point during the school day, once the period has passed. Some parents have raised concerns that children are returning to school before the end of this exclusion period, which can then spread infection further.

We have a capable cleaning team who clean classrooms, water fountains, toilets and communal areas every day. This means that the facilities are as clean as possible. We have a duty to provide drinking water for all children at school so drinking fountains remain in use. Many children choose to bring their own water bottles to school and it is helpful if they take these home every night for a wash then bring them back the next day.

This week we have also reminded the children about the importance of handwashing properly (noting that a brief splash of water won't do it!) and following the 'Catch it, bin it, kill it!' principles. We are also in the process of purchasing hand sanitiser pumps for the school hall so that children can do an extra top up as they pass to collect their school meal.

We hope that the winter illnesses will pass soon, so that the children can return to their normal good health.

What has the funding raised by Pupils at the Christmas Fair been used for? Topaz (R)

We bought some big wooden blocks for building outside.

Emerald (Y1)

We spent the money on furniture and preparation for the circus environment.

Jet (Y2)

We have spent some on the classroom environment (table covers, books for the project). We will be using the rest to buy resources for our SS Great Britain environment in term 4 and some more small tables or cushion rests Y3 have.

Crystal (Y3)

We spent our money on classroom furniture and other items to support our projects over the next two terms. (e.g. our roundhouse fire).

Diamond (4)

We spent our money on buying construction equipment for the children for new project this term.

Pearl (Y5)

The money was spent on our sensory garden for plants, fencing and other resources to make parts of the garden.

Amethyst (Y6)

Amethyst class raised £80 from their Fair Trade stall. They have donated £40 to The Kyatika Children charity in Uganda, a group of orphans that we have made a link with. We have yet to spend the other £40, it will be spent on the classroom environment in discussion with the children.

"Year of Computing' update

Our Year of Computing was launched with a Computing themed coffee morning where the children in Year 5 demonstrated various resources we have in school with parents and children. A competition was also held for the best Computing themed cakes which Douglas (Y6) and Ruby-Jo (Y5) won.

So far this year we have also gathered opinions from the children (including the involvement of our newly appointed digital leaders) about how they would like to see our ICT suite transformed. The transformation has begun and will continue to be changed over the coming months to make the space more open and allow children to explore many different technologies with designated areas for animation and green screen filming as well as space to use the programmable devices more freely. We will be running a competition soon to come up with a name for the new area and design a sign.

Later in the year we will be holding both Scratch and Lego animation challenges within school and at home for you all to join in with. We will also be having Aardman come in to school to run model making workshops which we will follow up with learning around animation.

We will also be looking to begin a Coding club for children to take part in after school.
