We have enjoyed a successful fortnight, with the children forging forward with their learning and showing enthusiasm for their projects. It is such a pleasure to have all the children back in school with us again. We are really proud of how they have all managed the transition and settled back into learning and social aspects of school life.

Thank you for your continuing support in keeping our children and staff safe by making sure that children stay at home if they are unwell with possible symptoms; arranging tests for coronavirus where needed; adhering to social distancing and one way systems. We have been informed that there is now a testing centre at UWE, so in the event that a member of your household had symptoms, it should be possible to arrange a test in South Glos.

We hope that everyone stays safe and well. Our attendance remains high and all families are making every effort for children to be in school everyday. Thank you.

Attendance

- All children are expected to attend school every day, as long as they are well (see link to the right for advice). We are very pleased that all children have returned to school in September.
- Holidays in term time are not authorised and holidays should be booked in the 13 weeks school holidays.
- If your child has a persistent cough, a temperature of 37.5°+ or loss of taste or smell, contact the school office, keep them and all members of the household at home and arrange for a coronavirus test. Once the test result returns, please contact the school office to inform. Negative results (and as long as no one else in the household has symptoms) mean that the household are safe to go about their normal routines and the child(ren) can return to school.

Pupil Places


We are pleased to have welcomed a number of new children to our school (as well as the Reception children) this term and we know there are a further few families awaiting decisions from admissions.

Meetings in Terms 2-4 are likely to be carried out remotely.


Free school meals


Free school meals are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods, and your monthly average income over three assessment periods should be no more than £616.67)
- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

COVID-19 (coronavirus) testing: Guidance for parents and carers



What to do if	Action needed	Back to school
COVID-19 (coronavirus) symptoms*	 Child shouldn't attend school Child should get a test Whole household self-isolates while waiting for test result Inform school immediately about test results 	when child's test comes back negative (if child no longer has symptoms and is well)
-my child tests positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus)	 Child shouldn't attend school Child self-isolates for at least 10 days from when symptoms⁴ started (or from day of test if no symptoms) Inform school immediately about test results Whole household self-isolates for 14 days from day when symptoms⁴ started (or from day of test if no symptoms) - even if someone else tests negative during those 14 days 	After 10 days isolation, if child feels better and has been without a fever for at least 48 hours They can return to school after 10 days even if they have a cough or loss of smell / taste. These symptoms can last for several weeks once the infection is gone.
coronavirus) symptoms*	 Child shouldn't attend school Household member with symptoms should get a test Whole household self-isolates while waiting for test result Inform school immediately about test results 	when household member test is negative, and child does not have COVID-19 symptoms*

Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium is funding for children who are eligible for 'Free School Meals'. This funding follows the child throughout primary school, with approx. £1350 per year to help each child to achieve well in school and keep fit and healthy. Even if the family were only eligible to receive FSM for a short period, it is definitely worth applying for this funding, if you are eligible.

'Universal Free School Meals' is

different – this is the national free meals programme for all Infant children. Children can receive Universal free school meals in the infants <u>and</u> be eligible for Free School Meals (Pupil Premium).

Letter for parents on

coronavirus (COVID-19) testing

Public Health England has produced a <u>letter for schools and</u> <u>colleges to share with parents</u> which explains when a child requires a coronavirus (COVID-19) test and what the symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are.

The intention of the letter is to support parents and carers in identifying when their child needs to self-isolate as a result of displaying coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms and answer some of the questions parents may have around testing.
