From Mrs Williams:

Thank you so much to all members of our community for pulling together, looking after each other and being kind and supportive to us during these very challenging times. We are looking forward to welcoming all children back to school in September. During lockdown, we have been able to bring back two of the three year groups that we were asked to by the government. We would have liked to have been able to open a further 3 bubbles to accommodate the Year 1 children, but this has not been possible. We know that the government's decision for schools to hold off with opening further year groups will have been disappointing for parents (and children) and that children will have been to get back to school. We really look forward to seeing you all in September.

We know that education has been a different experience for every child and our teachers are keenly awaiting the return of their new classes. Whilst some children will come back with learning gaps, others will have kept up with the home learning tasks and will have fewer gaps in learning. We are ready for this and one of the main priorities for the start of the year will be to find out where every child's starting point is so that we can plan our recovery curriculum from this to support the children to catch up with learning as quickly as possible.

We are now planning for a safe return to school for all children and we will be adding some extra staffing capacity to help us to run the bubbles safely (so that staff do not need to work across bubbles). From September, the classes will be grouped in pairs to make four bubbles: Reception & Year 1; Year 2 (2 classes); Years 3 & 4 and Years 5 & 6. The bubbles will have different start and end of days, break and lunchtimes (see information below). We know that coronavirus has not gone away and we will continue to be vigilant in our safety measures to keep the children and staff safe and well.

- All children and adults will be expected to follow the safety measures (see below).
- It will be mandatory for all children to attend school every day. Punctuality is very important to help us to ease congestion around the site.
- All children will be expected to wear full school uniform. Children will come in to school in PE kits on PE days.

Safety Measures for September 2020

As coronavirus has not gone away, there will be a series of safety measures that we will put in place to protect the children and staff. The attached parent/carer's guidance (link below) provides more details.

- Any child or adult with symptoms of coronavirus <u>must not</u> come to school. School must be informed of any
 suspected cases of coronavirus immediately. The individual should take a test for coronavirus as soon as
 possible and report the results to school.
- In the event of a confirmed case, all children and staff in the bubble must follow the government's stay at home advice and self-isolate for 14 days. The bubble will be closed for this period.
- Children will be encouraged to wash their hands frequently.
- 'Catch it, bin it, kill it' approach to help good respiratory hygiene.
- Minimising contact and maintaining social distancing: children will be in bubbles with staggered starts, break times, lunchtimes and end of the day (see below). We have a number of measures in school to help protect the children and staff in this way. We will help the children to understand these measures as part of their return.
- Classrooms will be set up with easy clean surfaces and resources.
- All spaces around school will be cleaned frequently (we are currently recruiting a cleaner for the midday communal spaces cleaning, so that teachers, TAs, Admin and lunchtime staff do not need to continue to do this when we are fully open). Existing staff will continue to clean down classrooms during the day.

It is really important that children are picked up and collected <u>promptly</u>. Please line up at your allocated space and the time given (not too early, as another group might be using the same gate/door). If you are late because of an emergency, let the office know you have arrived. You may have to wait a few minutes until a member of staff from the bubble can come up to the office.

If your child is going to be absent for the day, then please let us know (with a clear reason for absence for our records). We need to know urgently if you child (or a member of the household) has symptoms of coronavirus.

Handwashing

The government regularly updates its guidance and has asked schools to share the updated information on handwashing. Please see below for details.

It is essential that everyone washes their hands more often, using soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Hand washing with soap employs mechanical action that loosens bacteria and viruses from the skin, rinsing them into the drain. Drying hands afterwards makes the skin less hospitable to the virus. Hand sanitiser can be effective if soap is not available or the situation makes using soap less feasible (i.e. when outside) but using hand sanitiser provides none of the virus-destroying friction that rubbing your hands together and rinsing with water provides.

School Meals

In September, the children will have the option to have a hot meal at school again at school (there have only been sandwiches since March). We will not be using the school hall to begin with and children will eat their lunch in their classrooms. The lunches will be provided in takeaway boxes and with disposable cutlery during this transition period.

All children should bring a bottle of water to school for lunch, whether they are having school meals or packed lunch.

School meals are free for reception, year 1 and year 2 children and £2.30 (two courses) for children in KS2. Unlike previous years, there has been no price increase this year. Payments must be made online in advance via Sims pay. No cash please. The school menu was emailed to parents on 10th July.

We are in the process of appointing additional lunchtime staff so that each bubble can have consistent staff with them for their lunch hour.

Dear Parent/Guardian

Re. Childhood Flu Immunisation - Academic Year 2020/21

The 2020/21 Flu Immunisation Programme is being led by Sirona care & health.

The nasal flu spray will be offered to children in Reception Year and Years 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.

You will receive a flu information pack in September 2020 which will include a letter, a consent form and a leaflet explaining the Childhood Flu Programme.

Parents/Carers will be asked to complete the consent form and return it to us in the original envelope. The consent form must be completed by someone who has parental responsibility for the child. This means that legally they have the power to make important decisions in relation to the child. One form must be completed for each child receiving the vaccination.

Once you have received your pack in September, please can we ask you to return the form(s) to school as soon as possible. Once you have returned the form to school, if you wish to change your mind you should contact us as soon as possible on 01275 373104. Any change should be notified to us at least 2 working days before the planned immunisation date at the school.

If your child currently has a health problem which prevents them attending school, we can arrange for them to be immunised at a community clinic. Please contact the team directly on sirona.sch-imms@nhs.net or 01275 373104



If you wish for your Y5/6 child to walk to or from school alone from September, you will need to complete a request for permission form.

Y6 parents who have already completed a form (pre-March 2020), will not need to fill this in again. If you have changed your mind and wish to withdraw permission, please contact the school office.

The forms have been sent to you by email and can be returned by email or in person via the school post box at the front of the school (preferably before term starts).

If you would not like your child to walk home alone between October and March clock changes, please contact the office.
