### Roadmap out of lockdown

## What are the current lockdown rules as of 8th March - Step 1 a?

'England is still in a national lockdown. You must stay at home, leaving only where permitted by law, and follow the rules in the national lockdown: stay at home guidance'.

- 1. Schools & childcare fully reopen.
- 2. People can leave home for recreational/exercise with their household/support bubble.
- 3. One person can meet with one person from another household (outside) for recreation or exercise.
- 4. Social distancing, wearing face coverings, regular hand washing etc still required.
- 5. 'Stay at home' rule still applies (see link about what's changed above).

## What implications are there for parents/children?


- The Government rules must be observed, as they are set out in law.
- Whilst children are in class bubbles at school, they should not be meeting with more than one friend from another household outside school. Outdoor gatherings with other household groups are still not allowed at present.
- Parents are not in the class bubble, so groups of mixed parents and children should not meet outside school yet (this changes to rule of 6 or two households at the end of March see next page).
- One adult can meet one adult from another household for recreation/exercise.

#### Roadmap out of lockdown -

#### What can we look forward to next?

The government have set out their roadmap out of lockdown so that we can have dates in mind for a gradual return to normal. Some of these dates were provisional and depend on infection rates, but there is every reason to be hopeful with the vaccine roll out and falling infection rates.

Here is a summary of the easing of restrictions, which might be helpful. The main document link is below, if you would like to read more.

There is a lot to look forward to in the coming months, as we start to be able to see friends and family again (hopefully with no limits by mid-June).

# Step 1 (b) 29th March

- Outdoor gatherings allowed rule of 6 or two households.
- Outdoor sports facilities reopen for formally organised outdoor sports.
- 'Stay and home' rule ends, but work from home where you can and limit number of journeys.

## Step 2 12<sup>th</sup> April (at the earliest)

- Shops, hairdressers, libraries, gyms etc open.
- Outdoor attractions (eg zoos) reopen.
- Self-contained accommodation (eg holiday lets with own facilities) open.
- Hospitality (pubs, restaurants) able to reopen for outdoor table service for 6 people or 2 households.
- No indoor mixing between households.
- Life events (weddings, receptions, wakes) up to 15 people.

## Step 3 17<sup>th</sup> May (at the earliest)

- Will be able to see more friends and family (i) up to 30 people outside; (ii) rule of 6 or 2 households inside.
- Indoor entertainment opens hotels, indoor exercise classes, cinemas, children's play areas.
- Life events (weddings, wakes, christenings) up to 30 people.
- Review of social distancing, face coverings etc to inform step 4.

### Step 4 21st June (at earliest)

- Removal of all legal limits on social contact.
- Remaining premises reopen.
