We are really excited to be able to welcome all children back to school next week. The children will be continuing on from their learning during the blended learning period and staff will be supporting their social and academic resilience over the coming month until the Easter holidays. Towards the end of this term, the teachers will assess the children in preparation for parents' evening at the end of April/ start of May

Our main priority will be to help the children to re-engage emotionally and socially in the coming week in particular. We will be using our Jigsaw PHSE programme resources as a main driver for this and refreshing ELLI with the children (see last week's Friday assembly). The staff know your children very well and will know how to tailor the provision to provide this support.

Whilst we are all thrilled to have a full school back in, we are still in a lockdown and the safety measures still apply. We continue to ask all children to be dropped off and collected by one person; all parents to wear masks once inside the school gates; follow the one way system; retain social distancing and move away swiftly from the site. I know everyone will be pleased to see each other and want to catch up, but please do not linger and congregate socially. Thank you for your co-operation. I know everyone craves freedoms again; this is only just around the corner.

Value this Term: Inclusion

This term we talk about the importance of being respectful of each other and tolerant of differing world views (linking to British Values). We are fortunate to have kind and considerate children, who enjoy making a positive impact on others through their thoughts, words and actions. We shine a light on this through this value.

Protective measures

To reflect the national gradual easing of restrictions, we will be continuing our protective measures for the time being and will start to ease in line with the progress nationally.

- Bubble groups to reduce social contact.
- Minimise contact across the site.
- Staggered drop off and pick up – with one way system, social distancing and masks for all adults. Please keep all children by your side in the waiting areas and disperse away from the site quickly.
- Staff will continue to be offered lateral flow tests (new from Feb 2021) and wear masks in the communal areas.
- Regular cleaning during the day and after school.
- Frequent handwashing.
- Respiratory hygiene – catch it, bin it, kill it.
- Ventilation around school and in classrooms.

We know that these measures are effective as we have had very few cases of covid in school and these were quickly contained.

As restrictions ease nationally, we will follow the DfE and local authority guidance about how to ease back to normal. We anticipate this to be gradual rather than sudden.

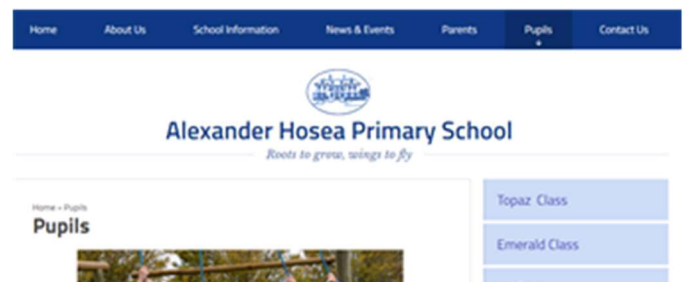

Winter Grant Scheme

The Winter Grant scheme aims to help meet immediate needs and really support those families who are struggling to afford food and utility bills (heating, cooking, lighting) and water for household purposes (including drinking, washing, cooking, central heating, sewerage and sanitary purposes), or other related essentials. The financial support could include more practical items such as purchase of blankets or more expensive items such as boiler / oven repairs or perhaps even a replacement oven if the existing one is broken beyond safe use / repair.
