From Mrs Williams:

***** 1 week to go until Christmas Fair (Saturday, 30th November) *****

This term is progressing at quite a pace and it is certainly feeling more wintery! In recent weeks we have been focussing on citizenship aspects of anti-bullying and charity work linked to Children in Need. The children donned their odd socks for anti-bullying awareness day. Whilst bullying is rare at our school, we use this week to help the children to know what to do if they are worried about themselves or someone else potentially experiencing this. We help the children to understand what bullying is (multiple incidents with an imbalance of power) and what it is not (e.g. a one-off falling out with someone); how they can seek help in school from a trusted adult and how to be a helpful rather than harmful bystander. The Pupil Council have redrafted the anti-bullying charter (which they do each year) and it will be shared by them in their classes.

As we move into December, we will commence our Christmas activities, which we hope will bring joy to the children and their families. Key dates and information is in this newsletter and on the weekly class newsletters, so please do make the time to read these. This is a particularly special time for our new Reception children who will be experiencing a school Christmas for the first time.

Some key dates for your diary:

Children's Christmas Gift Sale – The Friends are running a Christmas sale, so that children can purchase a 'secret' present for their special adults, during the school day on <u>Monday 25th November</u>. See FoAHS section below.

Christmas Fair – see information below <u>Saturday 30th November</u> in the Community Centre.

Class Product Sale – Classes will set up a sale of the items they have made in class after school (rather than at the Christmas Fair) on Monday 9th December. Weather permitting, this will be held in the playground (in the case of inclement weather, it will be in hall). Christmas Dinner – On Tuesday 10th December, the children are invited to have a Christmas Dinner at school for the same price as usual (FREE for Reception, Years 1 and 2; £2.30 for Years 3-6). We would like to thank them wholeheartedly for the time and dedication they have given to the roles and their unwavering commitment.


