Part of our school budget is determined by the number of children in the infants who have a school meal on census day. This is FREE for parents but makes a big difference to the school. We would greatly appreciate as many children as possible (in Topaz, Ruby, Emerald and Jet) having a free school dinner on this date.

The menu is swapped with Friday that week, so fish fingers and chips.
