PE reminder

On PE days, the children will continue to come in wearing their full PE kit. This is still a version of the school uniform and normal high standards apply. The children are allowed to wear any colour trainers, as we know that many children will only own one pair.

On every school day (PE or not), long hair must be tied up. Children are allowed to wear one small stud earring in each ear, although these should be removed (or removable by the child) or covered with micro pore tape for PE lessons (tape should be brought in from home). Thank you.
