Attendance of vulnerable children and children of critical workers

Limiting attendance at schools and colleges helps to support the reduction in the overall number of social contacts in our communities, which is a vital intervention in the context of current very high transmission rates.

As a school, we continue to offer attendance for those vulnerable children and children of critical workers who need to be in school. Where there is an adult at home to look after them, critical worker's children should remain at home.

Please only request places on the days that are absolutely necessary, so that we can keep our numbers on site to a minimum and reduce social contacts.

To reduce numbers in school for **Emerald and Diamond classes**, a separate letter has been sent out and the registers will close from Friday 29th Jan. Parents are reapplying for places for the w/c 1st Feb if they absolutely need it as they are going out to work and only for the days that they are working.

Deadline for applications is Weds 27th.

In all year groups, critical workers should not ask for places on days that they are not working (including furlough, maternity and other absence from work).

Thank you for working with us to reduce all of our social contacts and reduce the possibility of transmission of Covid 19.

Reporting Covid incidents during lockdown 3

While the majority of our families are learning at home, it is still important that you let us know of any suspected or confirmed Covid 19 cases in your household. We are required to report this to DfE.

If someone in your household is showing one of the main symptoms:

*A high temperature.

*A new, continuous cough.

*A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste.

Stay at home and get a test to check if you have coronavirus. The whole household must stay at home until a negative result is received.

Please let us know via the school office (phone message/email out of hours – see above), so that we can record these properly and adjust remote learning as appropriate.

As you may be aware, the Y6 tests will not be going ahead as normal. We are awaiting further information about assessment expectations from the Standards & Testing Agency in the coming weeks.
