Feedback from classes Jan 23

Feedback/Questions received from Diamond, Topaz and Pearl classes

Uniform: Would it be possible for parents to have uniform delivered to school by Monkhouse now that the store has moved away from Yate?

- Yes, this is possible. It is an option when you purchase online. School can text parents when the uniform arrives.

Consider

Clubs: Can there be more free after school clubs (eg run by staff)?

- Teachers are asked to run a club each year. As they have high workloads, they need to balance running a club with the commitment they have to high quality teaching and learning in their class. Some of the clubs are at lunchtime and some after school.
- We run a wide range of free clubs. This year so far:
 Mrs Williams ran chess club

Mrs Cleverly and Miss Clark ran reading club

Mrs Hillier is running poetry club

Mrs Joyner runs homelearning club

Miss Edgar, Mrs Gee and Mrs McAleese have run the school choir Mrs Newcombe has run coding club

Miss Williams and Mr Swann ran football club

Mr Swann ran cricket club

- School uses pupil premium to support families who are in receipt of free school meals to be able to attend some clubs for free.
- We are also very grateful to the parents who are running free clubs for the children too (eg netball, Lego Robotics, board games, recorder).
- We endeavour to offer a range of clubs to suit as many children as possible. Always open to looking at different clubs, where there is a particular interest.
- Year 3 suggested school could look into: cross country club, gardening, archery, fencing, choir for Y2-4.

Buddy system feedback

- Feedback from one parent that it works great most of the time, but sometimes children are less enthusiastic if paired with a peer who has a different learning attitude.
- Learning partners work well and partners are changed around at regular intervals. Helps children to learn to work with different people and prepare for the next stages of their education (eg at secondary school where many classes may have assigned seats) and the wider world/workplace.

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	 Water bottles: What prompts are younger children given to drink water? All children have access to their water bottles throughout the day and they are encouraged to drink. If these are forgotten, we can provide a cup for a day. They can refill their bottles in the classrooms. Infants take their water bottles up to the hall on their lunch box trolleys, so that they have them at lunchtime. There are also jugs of water and cups nearby, if they need these. Children are prompted at intervals during the day to have a drink and children in Reception have a drink with their fruit snack. If parents wanted to they could draw a line on the outside of the bottle, so that children know how much they would like them to drink by break/lunch.
