Reception and Y3 Parent/Carer Lunches

At the recent Catering Working Party meeting we agreed to host some sample sessions for parents/carers. As the Reception children are newest to the school and Year 3 is a changeover from universal free school meals, we decided that these year groups would be most appropriate. Dates to follow.

Each child can invite one adult to have a school meal with them. The cost is £2.80 per adult and £2.10 per child (free for Reception children). Both adult and child meals must be booked and paid for in advance.
