Dear Parents/Carers

We have enjoyed a busy and fun-filled fortnight. The music lessons are continuing with Jet, Crystal and Amethyst; Mrs Frampton has started her KS1 recorder club and the choir have been enjoying their singing experiences in preparation for the Young Voices concert in Birmingham in spring.

Mrs Grainger has organised the provision for annual anti-bullying week (next week) and the children are invited to wear odd socks on 19th November for Children in Need. Mr Leighton and Mr Winter-Alsop are setting up a new robotics club for Y5/6 children, which will culminate in a regional tournament in January. Rev Avent visited recently for CRY charity (https://www.cry.org.uk/) and Rev Russell led an assembly on Remembrance. We have a collection box for used stamps in the lobby if you would like to donate.

Directors of Public Health have advised that schools **continue** to implement the additional recommended measures in the regional response **until the end of November**, when this will be reviewed. This means that assemblies will remain online and additional midday cleaning will continue. We do not yet know what the December advice might be.

Flu Immunisations - postponed

The nasal immunisation that were due to take place in school on 17 November have been postponed due to the covid vaccination programme roll out for 12-15 year olds. These will be rescheduled.

Library Volunteers


We now have a team of Parent Helpers in the library so that the children can start to use as a lending service again. Thank you.

Anti-bullying Week

We will be taking part in the annual national anti-bullying week (w/c 15th November). On the Friday of this week, children are invited to wear odd socks for Children in Need day in exchange for a donation (via Sims pay) of £1.

Our Value of the Term is: Self-belief

This term we talk about believing in ourselves and how we see ourselves as learners. We talk about being purple learners and comfort, challenge and danger zones.



Learning pit

We talk about the 'learning pit' as the danger (red) zone. We support the children to learn to believe in themselves and use strategies to manage their feelings about being 'stuck' and get back into the challenge (purple) zone.

We also celebrate dips into the danger zone as the child could be on the cusp of learning something new.

Standing on the edge

We talk to children about 'standing on the edge'. This is when children are in the comfort (blue) zone, but we want them to believe in themselves, be brave and push themselves further to be in the challenge (purple) zone.

Challenge (purple) zone

We talk about being in the challenge zone as the optimum place to be - where learning is neither too easy nor too hard, but it is a good stretch for the brain. This is where there is appropriate challenge to help the learner to continually improve.



Cups and Awards



Supersonic Citizenship Award

Each term the teachers choose a 'supersonic' citizen from each class. The children can earn this by consistently demonstrating excellent attitude to learning and behaviour. From these nominations, staff choose a child from the infants and child from the juniors to win the Citizenship Cup (silver trophy), which they can take home and keep for a term. The awards are highly regarded and children strive to achieve them.



Haydon Music Award

The Haydon Music Award is also awarded 6 times a year. Teachers nominate children who they think show passion and commitment to music. The glass trophy is awarded to one child a term.



Creativity Award

The creativity award is a metal statue of a painter at work on a canvas. This termly award is given to one child a term for demonstrating exceptional creativity in their learning across the curriculum (eg art, writing, creative thinking/problem-solving).



Sporting Award

In October, we added a new award to our portfolio: the sports award. This has gone home with a Y3 child this term and will return for our December Cup Ceremony. The award is for exceptional contribution to sports and PE in school.





Toast service

- Annual finance report for AGM
- Signatory and access to WOOSC accounts
- Ad hoc review and audit of expenditure

If the roles are unable to be filled, WOOSC would unfortunately no longer be able to operate as these roles are core to the constitution, running, and governance of the club.


