## School Values - Review and refresh

We are in the process of reviewing our school ASPIRE values, which have been in place for more that a decade, to refresh them for this generation. So far we have consulted with children, parents/carers, staff and governors. Once we have collated the feedback from all of the groups, we will draft our new set of values to launch in the spring term.

The aim of the re-visioning is to review the values we share with the children and update to include new ideas into a streamlined values system. At the moment, we talk to children about:

- 1. **British Values** schools are required to teach children about democracy; the rule of law; individual liberty; mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.
- 2. **ASPIRE values** Adaptability, Self-belief, Perseverance, Inclusion, Respect and Enquiry (our values for more than 10 years)
- 3. **3 Bees** Be Kind, Be Respectful and Be Responsible (our school rules)
- 4. **ELLI** (Effective Life Long Learning Inventory from Bristol University) Curiosity, making links, resilience, learning relationships, creativity, strategic awareness, changing & progressing.

We know that the children have a better understanding of some aspects (eg 3 Bees and some parts of ASPIRE and ELLI) more than others and there are some overlaps between some areas too. With this in mind, we intend to draw out our new 6 most important values and then consider the skills the children will need in each part of their development to bring these values alive.
