








A busy two weeks in Crystal, we have been completing a lot of quizzes, and the children have championed them well!

As well as our quizzes, we have been researching Greek Gods and Goddesses for our English. Next week the children will be writing non chronological reports on Greek Gods and Goddesses. In maths, we are learning fractions and dealing with them in lots of different ways. We have been looking at unit and non-unit fractions, ordering and comparing them, finding fractions of amounts, adding and subtracting fractions, looking at equivalent fractions and putting fractions on a number line.

I have had a few emails about the spellings last week. This was part of our assessments and is something we do in class. This is unseen to the children hence why they weren't sent home to be practiced. The words are tricky, but it practices applying the spelling rules we have been learning in year 3. Spellings will be sent home to be practiced as normal Friday.

I will be testing times tables again weekly on a Friday to help children become more familiar with these. These are the 3's, 4's and 8's. up to 12x. Please practice these at home.
