

Class: Crystal and Diamond Date of project: Terms 1 and 2 More detail will be found on weekly newsletters Using the text 'Running Wild' by Michael Morpurgo as inspiration, the project will focus on the Indonesian rainforest. There will be an emphasis on the impact of deforestation and production of palm oil on the animals that live there – particularly orangutans. The story begins with the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami which the children will explore and learn about. Using Hokusai's 'The Great Wave off Kanagawa' they will create a textile piece of artwork

using lino print techniques and sewing with different stitches.

Linking science, computing, PHSE and geography, children will learn about the Indonesian rainforest, the plants and animals that live there and the human impact on the destruction of habitats. They will collect data on the changing environment whilst exploring environmental issues.

Finally, the children will consider how they can make a difference and highlight the issue to a wider audience. They will create pieces of music, films and persuasive writing to build a campaign. Within this, there will be a strong focus on developing oracy skills (speaking aloud for an audience with a specific purpose).
