<u>Collage</u>				
	Definition			
Collage	Art in which bits and pieces of paper and fabric have been pasted onto a 2D surface.			
Overlapping	Placing the materials partially over each other to create a multi-coloured or multi-textured image			
Overlaying	Placing lighter-coloured materials over the top of darker materials to create different tones.			
Texture	The feel of the surface of a material.			
Complementary colours	Colours which are close together on the colour wheel: Red, yellow, orange; blue, purple, red; blue, yellow, green.			
Contrasting colours.	yenow, green.			
	Colours which are opposite on the colour wheel: red and green; blue and orange; yellow and purple.
