Painting - ?

Prior knowledge/skills:

- I can mix paint to create a secondary colour by combining two primary colours.
- I can start to experiment with different tones by adding balk and white.
- I can use different brush sizes and types for a purpose.
- I can use different ways to apply paint (brush, hands, fingers, spatula)
- I can experiment with different textures (sand, sand sawdust, glue with paint)
- I know the primary colours and secondary colours and know where they are on a colour wheel.
- I understand the different properties of the paint types.
- I have an awareness of the variety of colour in the environment

Sticky Knowledge:

- To know how to mix paint to create all the secondary colours
- To know how to create brown with paint •
- To know how to create tints with paint by adding white and know how to create tones with paint by adding black
- To be able to discuss artist's use of painting effects

Potential Evidence to support our Artist:

- I can continue to use different brush sizes and types
- I know how to achieve tints by adding white.
- I know how to achieve black by adding black or darker colours
- I know how to mix secondary colours and can name them.
- I know how to mix paint to achieve brown
- I can explore wash, strokes, layers, blending, splash and dip techniques and I know how famous artists use these.
- I can use paint to create pattern and repetition and to add detail and sharp lines.
