


Alexander Hosea Curriculum Map – Y4

History enquiry question: What are the important moments in Bristol’s history?	
<p>Disciplinary Concepts: change and continuity, significance Substantive Concepts: settlements, trade, invention</p>	
<p>Programme of Study Statements</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a local history study <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ a study over time tracing how aspects of national history are reflected in the locality (this can go beyond 1066) 	<p>Key Vocabulary</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • port, trade, confluence, Severn, Avon, Frome, Saxons, Normans, Medieval, settlements, docks, merchants, Age of Discovery, invention, slaves, plantations, civil engineer, pioneer, steamship, locomotive, Industrial Revolution, British Empire, innovative,
<p>Disciplinary Knowledge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • sequence several events or historical figures on a timeline using dates • use a range of primary and secondary sources to find out about the past • gather more detail from sources such as maps to build up a clearer picture of the past • regularly address and sometimes devise own questions to find answers about the past • begin to undertake their own research • note key changes over a period of time and be able to give reasons for those changes • explain how people and events in the past have influenced life today • start to present ideas based on their own research 	<p>Substantive Knowledge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to know the origins of Bristol (settled by the Saxons and originally named Brig Stow – ‘place of the bridge’) • to understand the role the city’s location and geographical features played in its development (confluence of the Severn, Avon and Frome) • to understand the city’s role in the Age of Discovery (Cabot) • to understand the city’s role in the slave trade (Colston) • to understand how Brunel’s achievements affected travel and trade in the city • to understand the city’s role in air travel today (Aerospace)
<p>Prior Knowledge:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • know Wickwar is a village and it’s proximity to Bristol • know Wickwar is mainly a farming community 	<p>Future Knowledge:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • know how Wickwar and Bristol were affected during WW2

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • know the history and significance of weavers, potters, archers and brewers to the village • know who Alexander Hosea was and why he is significant to the village • know Wickwar once had a thriving High Street • know Bristol is our nearest city • know Brunel is a significant individual in Bristol's history 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • develop understanding of how settlements develop into towns and cities
