## Enquiry Question: Why did the Anglo Saxons and Vikings want to settle in Britain?

**Disciplinary Concepts:** cause and consequence, significance **Substantive Concepts:** invasion, settlements, trade, kingdom

## **Programme of Study Statements**

· Britain's settlement by Anglo-Saxons and Scots

#### Examples (non-statutory)

This could include

- Roman withdrawal from Britain in c. AD 410 and the fall of the western Roman Empire
- Scots invasions from Ireland to north Britain (now Scotland)
- · Anglo-Saxon invasions, settlements and kingdoms: place names and village life
- · Anglo-Saxon art and culture
- Christian conversion Canterbury, Iona and Lindisfarne
- the Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor

#### Examples (non-statutory)

This could include:

- Viking raids and invasion
- resistance by Alfred the Great and Athelstan, first king of England
- · further Viking invasions and Danegeld
- Anglo-Saxon laws and justice
- Edward the Confessor and his death in 1066

**Substantive Knowledge** 

- To know when the Anglo-Saxons invaded and settled in Britain
- To link the invasion with previous knowledge of invaders and settlers (Romans Year 5)
- To know where the Anglo-Saxons came from and why they settled in Britain
- To describe Anglo-Saxon art, culture, Kingdoms, place names and village life
- To know about Viking raids and invasions.

## **Disciplinary Knowledge/Skills**

- start to understand the difference between primary and secondary evidence and the impact of this on reliability
- begin to evaluate the usefulness of different sources
- use a wide range of different evidence to collect evidence about the
  past, such as ceramics, pictures, documents, printed sources, posters,

  figures, sculptures, historic sites
- understand and describe in some detail the main changes to an aspect in a period in history;
