

LIVING – L2.7 What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain today? (Year 3)

Key knowledge and skills of the unit

- Describe some examples of what Christians do to show their faith, and make connections with some Christian beliefs and teachings
- Describe some ways in which Christians express their faith through hymns and modern worship songs suggest at least two reasons why being a Christian is a good thing in Britain today and give reasons why it might be hard sometimes
- Discuss links between the actions of Christians in helping others and ways in which people of other faiths and beliefs, including pupils themselves, help others

Working towards

- Identify and name examples of what Christians have and do in the families and at church to show their faith
- Ask good questions about what Christians do to show their faith

Working above

- Explain similarities and differences between at least two different ways of worshipping in two different Christian churches
- Discuss and present ideas about what it means to be a Christian in Britain today, making links with their own experience
