

BELIEVING – L2.3 Why is Jesus inspiring to some people? (Year 4)

Key knowledge and skills of the unit

- Make connections between some of Jesus’ teachings and the way Christians live today
- Describe how Christians celebrate Holy Week and Easter Sunday
- Identify the most important parts of Easter for Christians and say why they are important
- Give simple definitions of some key Christian terms (e.g. gospel, incarnation, salvation) and illustrate them with events from Holy Week and Easter

Working towards

- Ask questions raised by the stories and life of Jesus and followers today; give examples of how Christians are inspired by Jesus
- Suggest some ideas about good ways to treat others, arising from their learning

Working above

- Make connections between the Easter story of Jesus and the wider ‘big story’ of the Bible (creation, the Fall, incarnation, salvation – see unit L2.2), reflecting on why this inspires Christians
- Present their own ideas about the most important attitudes and values to have today, making links with Christian values
