Year 4 Multiplication Check National Pilot 2019.

This week we have been busy preparing the children to take this test. We have been able to access the test and all the children have had a go. They have to answer 25 questions with 6 seconds for each and this is well within the current recall speeds of many of the children - I think they surprised themselves at how well they were able to achieve.

The practise was good in that the children were able to familiarise themselves with the format of the test .The children have told me that it is very similar to SOUNDCHECK on "Timetables Rockstars" so I have asked them to practise this from now on . I hope to do the test next week so I would be grateful if they could practise for at least 10 minutes a day this weekend. Thank you.
