
Diamond class cake sale: Diamond class are running a cake sale for us on **Tuesday 26 March** – please support them by bringing some change with you at pickup time on the day!

We do not authorise holiday during term time, so please book holidays during the 13 weeks of school holidays a year. Thank you.



New PE kit

Following on from Parent Council feedback, we are in the process of updating our PE kit, to address some of the concerns raised by children and parents, primarily:

- The t-shirts fade and are easily ripped.
- The PE hoodies fade and have a tight neck that makes it hard to get on and off.

The new t-shirts are made of performance material and will all be the school blue with logo. These will be available to order from Monkhouse from Jan 2025 (£11.25 approx). Children will be able to wear either the current t-shirts or new t-shirts until July 2025.

The new zip-front sports performance jumper, will be blue with the logo. These will be available from the end of May 2024 and the old hoodies will be phased out by the end of July 2025. Cost will be cheaper than current hoodies – approx. £19.50 each

Children will still need to wear black or navy plain (with no logo) school leggings/jogging bottoms or shorts. Socks must be plain white, navy or black (with no hoops or logos).

Please note the sizing for the PE tops are quite small. Matilda (pictured) wears size 4-5/5-6 usually and is wearing a size 7-8 PE top and zip jumper in the photos. We recommend sizing up for the PE tops.

The new attire is made from recycled bottles, helping us with our Eco ethos.
