



As it had been 42 days since we 'mummified' tomatoes (the Ancient Egyptians left their bodies in Natron – a type of salt – for 40-50 days to dry out), we uncovered them to see what had happened and compare them to the 'control' tomato we had not 'mummified'. It was fascinating to see how they had dried out but mostly retained their shape. It was also interesting to see how they varied depending on technique used during the 'mummification process'.











In English, we have finished and edited our Ancient Egyptian Sleepover stories. A huge amount of effort and enthusiasm has been put into these and many children did not want to stop writing which was wonderful to see.
