From Mrs Williams.

It was great to see parents back in person for parents' evenings recently. We hope that you found the meetings helpful in knowing how well your child is settling into their new school year. We are also really pleased to have an increasing amount of parent helpers around school. The children really benefit from the additional reading time that this can offer.

Rewards and awards: We have a positive behaviour management approach, where we are clear about our expectations and reinforce these by spotting children making good choices and being kind, respectful and responsible. Children can earn house points, Teachers' Awards and Head Teacher's Awards for extra efforts and achievements. The children are proud of themselves when they achieve these rewards.

At the end of each term (so 6 times a year), we have a cup award assembly to reward children who have been exceptional over the term in living our school values; music; creativity and sport (see below). Congratulations to our nominees and winners this term. We are proud of all our children for their achievements in Term 1 and look forward to seeing them continue to thrive as they move through the new term.



Supersonic Citizenship Award

Each term the teachers choose a 'supersonic' citizen from each class. The children can earn this by consistently demonstrating excellent attitude to learning and behaviour. From these nominations, staff choose a child from the infants and child from the juniors to win the Citizenship Cup (silver trophy), which they can take home and keep for a term. The awards are highly regarded and children strive to achieve them.



Haydon Music Award

The Haydon Music Award is also awarded 6 times a year. Teachers nominate children who they think show passion and commitment to music. The glass trophy is awarded to one child a term.



Creativity Award

The creativity award is a metal statue of a painter at work on a canvas. This termly award is given to one child a term for demonstrating exceptional creativity in their learning across the curriculum (eg art, writing, creative thinking/problem-solving).



Sports Award

The sports award is a silver plate which is awarded termly to a child who has shown exceptional contribution to sports and PE in school.

Excellent Pupil outcomes 2022

We are delighted with our excellent pupil outcomes in summer 22. In many measures (in EYFS, phonics, KS1 and KS2) we were significantly above national and in (at least) the highest 20% of all schools nationally. This is a major achievement in light of the disruption caused to pupils nationally and a credit to children, parents and staff for all their hard work and great engagement of families in continuing pupil's education both face to face and remotely. We look forward to another highly successful year this year.

Supporting your child with Reading

Our children are expected to read at least 5 times a week to help to build their word reading, fluency and comprehension.

Frequent reading is an essential part of children's learning and will help them to learn across the curriculum.

If you need any help in supporting your child with their reading, please contact your child's teacher.

Attendance

Consistently very good attendance helps children to access the full curriculum and receive the support and challenge needed to move their learning on. We are fortunate that the vast majority of our children attend school very well. We do not authorise holidays in term time, so please try to book holiday during the 13 weeks of school holidays.

% attendance will be monitored on a termly basis:

- 96%+ is expected and very good
- 95-95.9% is close to expectation
- 90-94.9% is cause for concern
- 89.9% or less is classed as persistent absentee.

Where attendance is becoming a concern, parents may be invited to School Attendance Meeting (with targets set for improvement) and fines may be incurred in the case of persistent absentees or prolonged unauthorised holidays (more than 5 days). Our S. Glos Education Welfare Officer supports us with attendance matters. Mrs Brooks (Heidi.Brooks@sgmail.org.uk) will be leading on attendance this year.
