Date of project: Terms 5 and 6

**English** – Linked to the book 'The Train to Impossible Places'. Text types: recounts - diaries, informal letter, setting and character descriptions leading to an additional chapter narrative. Linked to 'A Hero Like Me', persuasive and informative texts.

**Maths** – Statistics, measurement (time, converting between units of measure), co-ordinates.

**Science** – Electricity.

**DT** – Circuits and Switches.

**Art** – Drawing and painting skills. Artist study – Monet.

**History** – History of Bristol including: Age of Discovery (Cabot); Slave Trade (Colston); Trade and Travel (Brunel) and Bristol's role in air travel.

**Geography** – Fieldwork study about Wickwar, geography of Bristol and how it has changed over time including the development of transport.

**Computing** – Data Handling linked to maths and geographical fieldwork.

**PSHE** – Jigsaw (Relationships and Changing Me).

**RE** – Why is Jesus inspiring to Christians?

**PE** – Athletics, Sports Day practice and Outdoor Adventurous Activities

**French** – Language Angels – In the Classroom and At the Tea Room units

**Music** – Charanga (singing) – Blackbird
